Investment Philosophy

- Utilize long-term, measurable secular growth trends we anticipate to continue for 3-5 years.
- Identify premier growth companies with a focus on those with strong management teams, free cash flow, scalable business models with a competitive advantage, a history of high and increasing margins, and attractive valuations.
- 50-70 positions, with at least 75% of holdings with market cap greater than the median of the Russell 3000 Growth Index or \$5B, whichever is lower, at time of purchase. The remaining 25% may be invested in any market cap range.

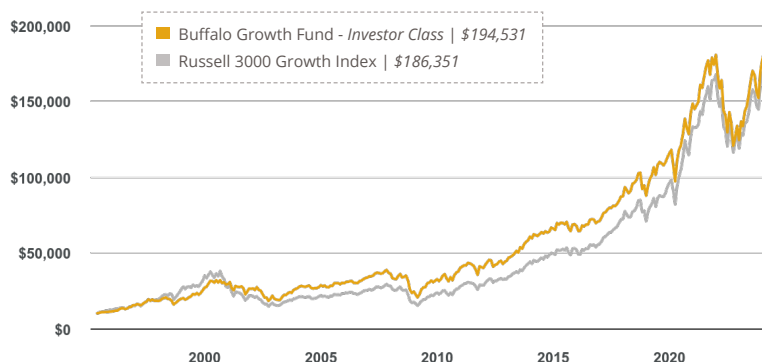

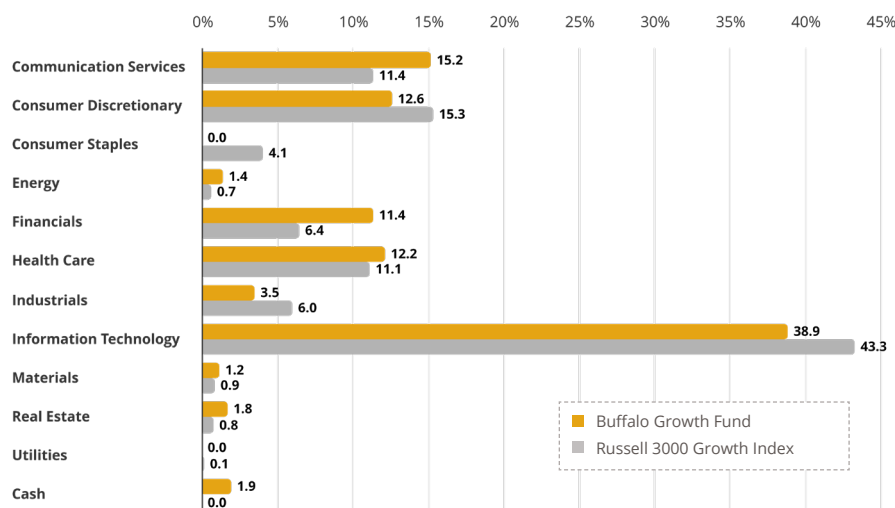

Mutual fund investing involves risk. Principal loss is possible. The Fund invests in small and mid-cap companies, which involve additional risks such as limited liquidity and greater volatility than large-cap companies. The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or “star rating”, is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a 3-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating™ for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its 3-, 5-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating™ metrics. The weights are: 100% 3-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% 5-year rating/40% 3-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% 5-year rating/20% 3-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent 3-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all 3 rating periods. The Russell 3000 Growth Index measures the performance of those Russell 3000 Index companies with higher price-to-book ratios and higher forecasted growth values. One cannot invest directly in an index. Market Cap is the market price of an entire company, calculated by multiplying the number of shares outstanding by the price per share. Free Cash Flow is a measure of how much cash a business generates after accounting for capital expenditures. Active Share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager(s) portfolio that differ from the benchmark index. Market Capture Ratio is a statistical measure of the Fund's overall performance in up-markets (positive return periods) and down-markets (negative return periods). The market capture ratios are used to evaluate how well an investment performed relative to an index during periods when that index has risen or fallen. Alpha is an annualized return measure of how much better or worse a fund's performance is relative to an index of funds in the same category, after allowing for differences in risk. Beta measures the volatility of the fund, as compared to that of the overall market. The Market's beta is set at 1.00; a beta higher than 1.00 is considered to be more volatile than the market, while a beta lower than 1.00 is considered to be less volatile. The Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return. Each Morningstar category average represents a universe of funds with similar objectives. Sector Allocation may not equal 100% due to rounding. *Top Ten Holdings for the quarter are not disclosed until 60 days after quarter end. Those listed are as of 12/31/23.
